Hidden Treasures in Academic Libraries

One advantage of using academic libraries (colleges and universities) is access to resources which help put your family history in context with the times in which they lived. The study of the lived experiences of the past is known as *social history*, and examines the lives of all individuals, not just the famous. To use an academic library effectively you need to view your ancestors through a different lens, beyond names and dates, and consider their occupation, migration, religion, ethnic origins and more.

A few tips before venturing to an academic library:

- Do your homework! Check the library’s website for information about hours, etc., before you go. Note, some units within a large library may have different hours.
- Check the library’s online catalog for books, maps, databases and more, and identify items you are interested in. Note the exact – and complete – call number and location.
- Look to see if the library has a digital collection of photographs and other material.
- If the library has a Special Collections, check their finding aids (also known as collections guides) for information about material within manuscript collections.
- Ask if the library has any important resources or indexes that have **not** been digitized!

Selected online databases to look for in academic libraries:

America: History & Life with Full Text

Scholarly articles on U.S./Canadian history.

Historical Abstracts

Index to scholarly articles covering world history (excluding U.S. and Canada) from 1450 to the present.

Daily Life Through History

Primary documents, essays, images, maps, and timelines depicting daily life around the world and throughout history.

American Periodicals

American magazines of the 18th, 19th and early 20th centuries.

Women's Magazine Archive

American & Canadian women's magazines including Good Housekeeping, 1885-2005; Ladies Home Journal, 1885-2005, and more.

Women and Social Movements in the U.S.

Primary sources dealing with women's history from 1600 to 2000.

In addition to databases, also check a library's list of electronic resources for digitized newspapers; local, national and international, Sanborn and other maps. HathiTrust (www.hathitrust.org) and JSTOR (www.jstor.org) are both digital libraries which contain millions of digitized books and journals. Much of the content is available for free, but libraries generally have subscriptions that provide access to even more content.

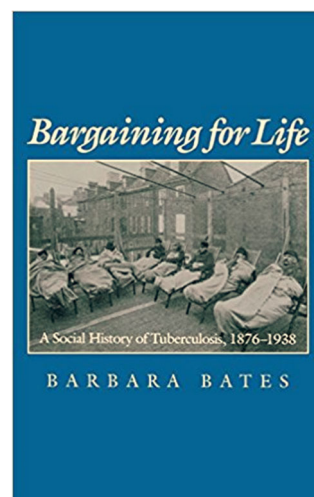

Biographical Note

Mabel Seagrave (January 3, 1882 – November 10, 1935) was an American doctor who directed a hospital in France during World War I, and was decorated by the French government for her service.

She was born in Cheyenne, Wyoming and raised in Seattle, Washington, the daughter of Arthur Amasa Seagrave and Selina Stone Glass Seagrave. Her father built and operated the Occidental Hotel in Seattle. She was valedictorian at Seattle High School in 1900. She attended Wellesley College, graduating in 1905, and Johns Hopkins University, where she earned her medical degree in 1912.

Immediately after medical school, Seagrave focused on oral surgery at the Municipal Clinic of Seattle. Seagrave joined the staff of Women's Oversea Hospitals (W. O. H.) in 1918, and was first posted to a refugee hospital in the south of France. After the armistice, she worked at a Red Cross hospital at Foug, and headed the Hopital Jeanne D'Arc at Nancy, France. She was presented with a medal from the French government in 1919.

After the war, Seagrave concentrated on obstetric and gynecological surgery. She was elected to the American College of Surgeons in 1928. She was active in the Women's Overseas Service League and the Women's University Club of Seattle. At the time of her death in 1935, she was Chief of Staff at Seattle General Hospital.

Historical Note

The Woman's Century Club was founded by ten Seattle women (including the club's first president, suffragist Carrie Chapman Catt) on July 31, 1891. The club was organized at the home of Julia E. Kennedy, Seattle's first female superintendent of schools. Its purpose was to promote the intellectual growth of its members and to lend its influence toward solving altruistic problems of the community. The club was named in reference to the nineteenth century, which many women called the Woman's Century in recognition of the great accomplishments women had made in those years. The Woman's Century Club, both a social and educational club, was comprised of "departments" or interest groups representing members' academic interests, including Art, Current Events, Drama, Household Administration, Literature and Travel, Music, Parliamentary Procedure, Philosophy and Science, Political Science, and Social Service. The club also served the community by, among other initiatives, paying the salary of the city's first librarian and working to raise the age of consent from 12 to 18.

After first meeting at the Seattle Public Library and at members' homes, the club built its own meeting space in 1925 at 807 East Roy Street (the Harvard Exit) in Seattle's Capitol Hill neighborhood. The space allowed the club to host popular activities including lectures and presentations, concerts, theatrical productions, receptions (one honoring Amelia Earhart in 1933), and more. Upon the building's transformation into a movie theater in 1968, the club continued to meet in the lobby of the Harvard Exit until January 2015. The building was then sold and slated for offices and a restaurant, and club meetings were held at the Dearborn House on First Hill.

For forty years between the 1920s and 1960s, the club also had a separate Juniors group that was open to the daughters of club members.
